- Collaborating and critically analyzing teaching plans for programs to ensure that activities are thoughtful, intentional, relevant to children and their communities, developmentally appropriate and connected to OWP's mission;
- Being a resource for program teachers to plan lessons/activities and problem-solve challenges that arise in their classrooms;
- Gaining knowledge of local artists, events, and community-based organizations for program teachers to draw from;

• Crafting and signing off on global plans for all after school and camp programs.

Outreach

- Cultivating relationships with parents and the broader community that foster participation and contribute to children's and organization's development;
- Representing OWP at teacher recruitment and community events, building relationships with relevant organizations.

Leadership Team Collaboration & Strategic Planning

- Collaborating with the leadership team to learn from OWP's past and shape its present and future;
- Actively participating in the hiring process for future teachers and administrative staff to ensure that OWP maintains a strong team aligned to the organization's mission.

- In collaboration with the Executive Director, articulating strengths, areas for improvement, and realistic goals to guide growth and reflection;
- Seeking and being open to regular feedback from the Executive Director as well as other colleagues;
- Actively participating in and preparing for bi-annual appraisal conversations with the Executive Director;
- Proactively seeking and engaging in relevant professional development opportunities aligned to personal and professional goals and interests;
- Thinking big regarding his/her own growth and future in the OWP family.
