Assistant Teachers often provide direct instructional support to children by facilitating whole and small group lessons and activities.

Responsibilities

Responsibilities:

- Ensure the physical, social, and emotional wellbeing of children in the classroom under the supervision of the lead teacher.
- Work in collaboration with the lead teacher in managing classroom activities, supporting the individual needs of children, and engaging in age-appropriate conversations and interactions with children that expand their learning and supports their social and emotional development.
- Work in collaboration with the lead teacher with supervising, caring, and supporting the children's physical needs including supporting with toileting, diapering, and other self-help skills.
- Work in collaboration with the lead teacher with the implementation of classroom activities
- Including leading small group activities with the children as instructed by the lead teacher.
- Work in collaboration with the lead teacher in implementing children's interests and exploration of learning activities and expand children's play by expanding their thinking, language, and problem-solving skills.
- Follow children's interests and engage in play with them by following their lead while introducing new concepts and ideas.

- Encourage and celebrate children's primary languages, cultures, and diverse backgrounds through classroom activities, books, and the classroom environment.
- Follow all necessary safety and reporting procedures.
- Maintain documentation.
- Other duties as instructed by supervisor.
